Housing

- If you have been impacted by the wildfires, you can apply for up to \$7,000 in assistance, applicants must have had damage or loss to their primary residence due to a wildfire and residence is considered uninhabitable unless repaired or replaced. Applicants must have an income that is at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines. Applicants must provide documentation of loss, proof of homeownership and proof of household income.

Food:

- For people who are on SNAP and have lost their food due to the wildfires, they can have up to \$200 of their SNAP benefits reloaded onto their cards. If someone is in that situation, they would need to contact the local ODHS office and fill out a short form stating what food they lost and how they were impacted by the fires. They don't need to go to "their" ODHS office, they can go to the one closest to them if they have been evacuated.
- Even if someone isn't on SNAP currently or has other wildfire-related safety net needs, this local rep really wanted to make sure that we are getting the word out that they are also helping coordinate basic needs for evacuees, such as food boxes, etc.
