



If passed by voters on May 15, 2018 the proposed \$619.7 million bond would increase the current property tax levy rate by an estimated \$1.24 per \$1,000 of assessed property value. If the bond does not pass, the additional tax would not be levied and the listed projects would not be completed. The Community Facilities Task Force reviewed all funding methods available to the district and recommended the School Board place a general obligation bond on the ballot for voters to consider. The district would receive an \$8,000,000 grant from the state if bonds are passed.

Grant Elementary School

Grant Elementary School is a two-story facility constructed in 1952. The school is near capacity with stable enrollment projected through 2025. The identified building projects would include music room improvements, heating/ventilation and plumbing work. Technology and communications improvements would include expanded wireless capacity and intercom system upgrades. Bond funds would also be used provide updated electronic key access and seismic improvements. Site work would include replacement of the hardscape in the courtyard area. The school's kitchen would receive upgrades to improve food production and/or serving efficiency.

If the bond passes:

- Intercom system upgrades
