



If passed by voters on May 15, 2018 the proposed \$619.7 million bond would increase the current property tax levy rate by an estimated \$1.24 per \$1,000 of assessed property value. If the bond does not pass, the additional tax would not be levied and the listed projects would not be completed. The Community Facilities Task Force reviewed all funding methods available to the district and recommended the School Board place a general obligation bond on the ballot for voters to consider. The district would receive an \$8,000,000 grant from the state if bonds are passed.

Houck Middle School

Houck Middle School is a two-story facility constructed in 1995. Eight (8) portable classrooms were added to accommodate previous enrollment growth. The identified expansion projects would increase the size of the cafeteria as well as add two (2) science labs, providing sufficient classrooms and core areas to meet projected student enrollment through 2025. The identified building improvement projects would include exterior seal, roofing replacement and library improvements. Technology and communications upgrades would include expanded wireless capacity and intercom system upgrades. Bond funds would also be used to update electronic badge access to exterior doors.
