## Title 1 Parent Involvement Policy

At Keizer Elementary School, we believe the education of our children is a collaborative effort involving students, teachers, parents, and community working together to achieve high academic and personal performance. Parents can participate in their child's education and receive information in the following ways:

1. Annual Meetings - Due to COVID-19 restrictions, instead of holding our Annual Title 1 meeting in person, Keizer is posting the following information on the school website as well as Keizer's Facebook page on October 9, 2020:
  - a. What it means to be a Title 1 school
  - b. Rights of Title 1 Parents
  - c. School Data
  - d. Overall School BudgetKeizer will also host another follow-up Title 1 meeting in the Spring of 2021. Details to follow.
2. School-Parent Compact and Survey - The School-Parent Compact is a communication tool to support achievement for parents, school staff, and students. The Compact is an agreement on how parents and educators will support each other in ensuring that the students are successful. Attached to the Compact is an online survey allowing parents to ask questions and supply feedback. Keizer is asking that the Compact Survey be completed by October 15, 2020. Again, Keizer has posted the School-Parent Compact/Survey on both the school website and Facebook pages.
3. Parent Information & Communications – Keizer will primarily communicate information regarding the school and activities in the form of website and Facebook posts, phone calls, Remind, and reader board. Once COVID-19 restrictions are lifted, families will also receive flyers and newsletters. Parents will also receive the following student academic information:
  - a. Notification of their children's academic progress through progress reports (November, March, and June); Parent Conference (October 19 & 26 and March 15); and informal contacts throughout the year as needed.
  - b. Individual assessment results, known as the Records of Standard Achievement (RSA), and the interpretation of these results through a district mailing by the end of June.
  - c. A description of grade-level expectations and CCSS will be presented to parents at conferences on October 19<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup>.

Keizer Elementary School utilizes a Community School Outreach Coordinator (CSOC) to serve and provide assistance to the community. This coordinator works closely with the community providing resources and encouraging parents to get involved within the school. This person also conducts home visits, coordinates events, and connects with business partners.

If parents request, the school will provide opportunities for regular meetings virtual due to COVID-19 and allow parents to give suggestions in the decisions being made in the education of their children.
