

# Grading in Comprehensive Distance Learning

All teachers have continued to teach to the National and State Standards, including Physical Education and Music during Comprehensive Distance Learning or CDL. Assessing skills in a virtual setting are challenging, especially skills that involve movement or sound. Some skills have been taught, but not assessed or graded. For those areas not graded you will see a "/" in the skill grade.

The main grade that you will see in Physical Education is for **Responsible Personal and Social Behavior**. In online PE and Music, the focus is for students to have their cameras on and be actively participating. This provides evidence of the student learning and participating. Here are what the scores on the report card mean:

1 =

Little or no evidence towards standards (Did not participate, did not attend or attended with cameras off)

2 =

Making progress towards standards (Attended and participated in most online PE/Music classes.)

3 =

Meeting standards (Goal by end of year. Attended classes almost always, participated entire class time, and turned in assignments and which contain 80-95% correct answers.)

4 =

Exceeding standards (Attends every class, always participates, can teach a skill to someone else, and turns in every assignment with scores above 95%)
